1. Mayor Kourianos called the regular meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. The Mayor stated that do to the current COVID-19 situation, the City Council meeting is being held electronically via telephone conference call. 2. Mayor Kourianos led the Pledge of Allegiance.

a. April 22, 2020 City Council Meeting

- 9. Project 7C-2020: 10 WHEEL DUMP TRUCK WITH DUMP BED - Consideration and possible approval of the purchase of a 10-wheel dump truck for the Water & Sewer Department. Six (6) qualified sealed bids were received: Mountain West (Mack) \$129,261.50; Premier Truck Group (Western Star w/W-G Bed) \$145,434.00; Premier Truck Group (Western Star w/Owen Bed) \$161,491.00; Premier Truck Group (Freightliner w/W-G Bed) \$133,455.00; Premier Truck Group (Freightliner w/Owen Bed) \$149,512.00; Rush Truck Center (International) \$132,150.49. Recommendation is to purchase the 2021 International Model HV613 SBA from Rush Truck Center due to the eligible \$10,000 rebate available from the Navistar Class Action Lawsuit (Net Purchase = \$122,150.49).
- 10. BUSINESS LICENSES - Consideration and possible approval of business licenses for: Castle View Awards, LLC at 503 Homestead BLVD and Tips & Toes with Torie at 235 North 5th Ave.
- 11. UNFINISHED BUSINESS – Mayor Kourianos discussed the possibility of drawings being painted on the walls of the underpass/bridge to Price City. The underpass/bridge belong to the State of Utah, Department of Transportation. Any drawings would need the approval of the Department of Transportation and the Mayor and City Council. Councilmember Miller discussed Culture Connection. It has been decided that due to the current COVID-19 Circumstance, Culture Connection will be cancelled. If circumstances change, local bands can be utilized to provide entertainment.
Councilmember Miller discussed outdoor murals. A professional artist that teaches at USU-Eastern may be a candidate to paint murals. He could supervise his students to paint the murals. The project could start small. Several locations throughout the city could be chosen. All examples and locations for murals would need to be approved by the Mayor and City Council. Perhaps the first thing to do is to choose a vision of what we want our community to look like. Carbon High School should be included in this project. Councilmember Miller will keep the Mayor and City Council updated.
Councilmember Knott-Jespersen discussed International Days. After the meeting with the Southeast Health Department and a conference call with the Utah League of Cities and Towns later on this week she will have recommendations to be considered.
