1. Mayor Kourianos called the regular meeting to order at 5:31 p.m.
2. Mayor Kourianos led the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Roll was called with the above Councilmembers and staff in attendance. Councilmember Marsing was excused/absent.
4. SAFETY SECONDS – Mayor Kourianos reminded everyone to wear a mask and practice social distancing.
5. PUBLIC COMMENT –  
Jill Oakley and Mathew Sorensen commented on the pickle ball court:
  - ✓ Improvements to the courts
  - ✓ The possibility of developing a committee to enhance pickle ball play
  - ✓ Short term and long term plans for the pickle ball court
  - ✓ What kind of organizational structure should be used for them to provide input to Price City
  - ✓ Start a pickle ball club
6. QUARTERLY SAFETY PRIZE - Quarterly prize drawing for qualifying employees for safety practices in the workplace.  
Nick Tatton reviewed the safety program. Mathew Sorensen, a community member in attendance, pulled the winning ticket. Linda Allred was announced as the winner of the quarterly safety prize. The Mayor thanked the city employees for their continued efforts to work safely.

A brief discussion was held on Item 8 regarding the bid process and contractor selection.

8. LIBRARY RAMP BID - One bid was received from Delbert Thayn Construction for \$54,320 for the library ramp project. The bid exceeded budget. Staff would like to propose that the bid not be accepted. Staff would like City Council approval to solicit for quotes in an attempt to keep the project within budget.
9. ANNUAL WATER OVERAGE REPORT - Consideration and possible approval of the annual Water Overage Report. This is the report that reconciles water problems that occurred during the winter months. This year had customers and a total credit of \$3,234. The Water Department can issue credit for up to \$1,359. This leaves a remaining balance of \$1,875 needing City Council approval.
10. BUTCH CASSIDY TRAIL SIGN - Consideration and possible approval for Altitude Cycle to place an informat board for the Butch Cassidy Bike Trail. The information board will be located at the top north west corner of the Atwood Ball Field Complex and be similar in appearance to the one at the Pump Park.
11. BUSINESS LICENSES - Consideration and possible approval of business licenses for: G & A Windows at 127 N and House of Angels at 710 N 7 E.
12. UNFINISHED BUSINESS – No unfinished business discussed.
