1. Mayor Kourianos called the regular meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.
2. Mayor Kourianos led the Pledge of Allegiance. Pastor Chris Polito with Gospel Community Church offered a word. Pastor Polito informed the Mayor and Council about new shirts, in a wide variety of sizes, and miscellaneous clothing items the church has for anyone in need. Citizens can contact the church for more information.
3. Roll was called with the above Councilmembers and staff in attendance.
4. SAFETY SECONDS – Mayor Kourianos stated that the Utah Department of Environmental Quality has a Danger Advisory in place for Scofield Reservoir. Harmful algal blooms were observed and cyanotoxin and cell density samples were collected. Results are pending, Protect yourself during harmful algal blooms to keep yourself, your family, and your pets safe.
5. WATER CONSERVATION UPDATE -
Price City's drinking water is safe. Water demand is down and still tracking well below average. Citizens are still being diligent. Price City's water campaign is working. Thank you to all citizens for their diligence efforts to conserve water. Miles Nelson reviewed the water conservation information update provided:
Water Resources Update as of July 26, 2021:
 - As of July 25, 2021, Scofield Reservoir had a water content of 23,814 Acre Feet (36% capacity).
 - Precipitation Accumulation (October 1, 2020 – July 26, 2021) = 13.4" (58% of average).
6. PUBLIC COMMENT – Commander David Jelin, Veterans of US Armed Forces, addressed the Mayor and Council. He presented the City with five flags that represent all branches of the service to be placed in the Peace Garden. The flags are donated personally from Commander Jelin. He has reviewed the proper mounting/maintenance with Bret Cammans. He thanked everyone for the improvements when displaying/caring for the flags at Washington Park. The memorial is looking better and the flags are displayed correctly and are in proper condition. He reviewed the Memorial Day signs at the cemeteries and commented that the flag efforts and the City efforts were good this year. Mayor and Council thanked Commander Jelin for his generous flag donation and expressed appreciation for his diligence and working with the City.
7. PRESENTATION / COMMENTS FROM DOUG FOLSOM - Doug Folsom from the ULGT will present safety and risk management data to Price City.
Doug Folsom, Loss Prevention Consultant with Utah Local Government Trust, addressed the Mayor and Council. He made a brief presentation regarding the safety and risk management programs for Price City. Management's involvement is crucial for a successful program. The programs are effective and help keep employees safe.
