1. Mayor Pro tempore Marsing called the regular meeting to order at 5:31 p.m.
2. Mayor Pro tempore Marsing led the Pledge of Allegiance. Pastor Mele Afu with Price United Methodist Church offered a word.
3. Roll was called with the above Councilmembers and staff in attendance. Mayor Kourianos was excused.
4. SAFETY SECONDS – Mayor Pro tempore Marsing reminded everyone that school starts next week and there will be many children walking on the roads, crossing streets and walking along the sidewalks. He reminded everyone to stay safe and keep an eye out for them as they are going to and from school.
5. WATER CONSERVATION UPDATE – Miles Nelson presented the water conservation update:
Water Resources Update as of August 9, 2021:
 - As of August 8, Scofield Reservoir had a water content of 22,612 Acre Feet (34% capacity).
 - Precipitation Accumulation (October 1, 2020 – August 9, 2021) = 15.5” (65% of average).He stated that the recent rains were a good thing but the bad part that comes with the rainstorms is when the rain comes through the canyon and it hits the burn scars from the recent fires it brings debris into the river. Due to this, the Price River Water Improvement District urged customers to cease all outside watering with culinary water and a reduction of the use of water whenever possible until August 4th. The crews are working diligently to treat the water. The city is still tracking below and conservation efforts are still working well.
6. PUBLIC COMMENT – No public comment was received on any item.

8. PRICE CITY RADIO UPGRADE PROJECT-USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT COMMUNITY FACILITIES DIRECT LOAN/GRANT REVISION - Consideration and possible approval for Price City to pay the balance for the purchase of radios.
9. GENERAL ENGINEERING SERVICES AGREEMENT: MAIN STREET TO NICK LANE SEWER EXPANSION – Consideration and possible approval of a general engineering services agreement with Johansen and Tuttle Engineering for design and related engineering services for the expansion of the sewer system from main street to Nick Lane. The bid amount exceeds the budgeted funds available for the project. Recommendation is to reject the bid from CKC Operations and no contract to be awarded.
